Jayne Gibson Johnson, 82, of Hot Springs Village, AR. died on February 14, 2010 at a local hospital.

Mrs. Johnson was born in Charleston, South Carolina, on August 8, 1927, to John Clyde and Jane Rachel Cathey Brown. She grew up in Enterprise, Alabama, living with her aunt and uncle, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Calvin Yarbrough.
